crossing – cruce	Peligroadelante – Danger ahead
bend – curva	Carretera mojada – Wet road
danger – peligro	Paso de peatones – Pedestrian Crossing
dead end – sin salida	Pare - Stop
detour – desvío, desviación	Niñoscruzando – Children crossing
downtown – centro	speed limit — velocidadmáxima
toll – peaje	Despacio– slow/down
viewpoint – mirador	speed bump – badén
exit – salida	prohibited – prohibido/a
lane – carril	road closed – carreteracerrada
no entry – prohibido el paso	
no passing – adelantamientoprohibido	
one-way – (vía de) sentidoúnico	
parking – estacionamiento, aparcamiento	pedestrians – peatones
